CAC receives \$18,000 grant from Cleveland-Cliffs Foundation to expand our Youth Arts Outreach Program

This generous gift from Cleveland-Cliffs Foundation will allow us to expand our Youth Arts Outreach Program in partnership with the Duneland YMCA and Duneland Boys & Girls Club. We will now be able to serve all five YMCA elementary after school sites simultaneously, basically doubling the number of young artists served with our weekly visual arts instruction.

ARTWORK DROP OFF will be Thursday November 30 and Friday December 1 from 10 am to 4 pm

- All current CAC members are invited to submit original work for this annual exhibit. Please contact the Center if you are unsure of your membership status.
- Member artists may submit two pieces smaller than 16 in x 20 in OR one larger piece not to exceed 24 x 30 inches. Please contact us with any questions.
- All artworks must be framed and/or ready to hang to be accepted. Sculptural works will be placed on pedestals in the gallery.
- All artworks must be clean (no dust or scratches on frames or mats) to be accepted.
- Members may only submit works that have not been shown at the Center in the past year, including in the member gallery or gift shop and last year's member exhibition.
- Artworks in the Members' Exhibit may be available for sale, and CAC will take a 30% commission on any sold artworks.

With guidance from CAC instructor Emily Blossom, students explored outer space themes and learned about different atmospheres, designed spacecraft, and invented their own planets and alien creatures.

After School Art

Acrylic Landscapes

The October sessions of After School Art are instructed by Jen Aitchison and will focus on acrylic painting & landscapes. Students will learn to mix their own colors and work to understand value, perspective, and composition as they create landscape paintings inspired by CAC's current exhibition of Duneland Plein Air Painters as well as historic landscape painters like Claude Monet, Winslow Homer, and J.M.W. Turner.

After School Art classes are offered every month from September-May for ages 5-16. During each 4-class monthly session, students will explore an arts-related topic, movement, or technique through a variety of 2D media such as watercolor, pastel, graphite, acrylic, or printmaking.

After School Sculpture

Clay Pinch Pots

The October session of After School Sculpture is instructed by Terese Maletta and will focus on the clay hand building technique of pinch pots. The pinch method is a fun way to work with clay by simply "pinching" the clay between your fingers to form small bowls, hollow vessels, or bases for larger projects. During this class, students will create pinch pot creatures with additional sculptural elements that will be glazed and fired.

After School Sculpture class is offered every month from September-May for ages 8-12. During each 4-class monthly session, students will explore an arts-related topic, movement, or technique through a variety of 3D media such as clay, plaster, paper mache, or mixed materials.

Preschool Pop-In

Colorful Pumpkins

The October session of Preschool Pop-in is instructed by Jen Aitchison and will focus on colorful pumpkins! Students will learn to mix their own colors and create a scene of pumpkins to commemorate the fall season.

Preschool Pop-Ins are offered on the 2nd Tuesday of each month from 9-10:30 AM and are recommended for ages 3-5. Young artists will focus on the development of fine motor skills through creative arts learning experiences. Each class will focus on a unique theme that highlights color, shape, cutting, building or painting.

Parents and/or caregivers are encouraged to stay and create together with their young artist.

LEGO Printing Workshop

Ages 8-14 / Saturday, October 21 from 10 AM-12 PM

With guidance from Brian Dortmund, this workshop will highlight traditional printmaking techniques through a modern method of printing with LEGO tiles. Students will create their very own words or design using special LEGO sets, allowing students to explore 'Type' in totally new ways. Students will learn how to properly ink their design, title their work, and successfully pull a print as they take home a small edition of handmade prints.

Adult Art Classes

Our classes provide a creative space for artists to learn at every age and level.

Independent Study Studio Art

5-class session / Monday,
October 2-30 from 10 AM-12 PM

With guidance from Diana Stezalski, this class is designed for experienced students who are ready to move beyond foundational skills and want dedicated studio time. Each class will present a new exercise that challenges students to escape creative blocks and push their creative practice further along. The rest of class time will be dedicated to independent studio time, critique and feedback, and/or collaboration with peers. This class is recommended for intermediate+ students who work with acrylics, oils, drawing media, or mixed media. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$90 for non-members / \$81 for current CAC members + supply list

Multi-Range Drawing

4-class session / Wednesday,
October 4-25 from 10 AM-12 PM

With guidance from Diana Stezalski, this multi-range class will allow students to explore the vast possibilities of drawing methods and media. Students will learn to draw from observation, practice shading techniques, and work with a variety of media including ink pens, charcoal, and graphite. Line, tone, perspective, and composition will be addressed throughout each lesson as students study the work of other artists as a point of reference. This class is recommended for beginners, but all levels are welcome. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Fall Colors in Pastel Workshop

2-day workshop / October 7-8
from 9:30 AM-3 PM

With instruction from IAPS Master Circle pastelist Mary Ann Pals, students will work from reference photos and learn how to use soft pastels combined with alcohol to render wet underpainting, then layer dry pastels on top to create a vibrant fall scene. Mary Ann will give demonstrations and will also provide individual help to students. This workshop is recommended for advanced beginners + above. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Mosaic Workshop

2-day workshop / Saturday,
October 7 from 10 AM-1 PM &
Saturday, October 14, 10-11 AM

With guidance from Judy Gregurich and Mark Montgomery, students will learn the process of stained glass mosaics as they artfully design their own 8"x8" mosaic window. The first day will involve hands-on guidance as students create and glue their mosaic design, and then the second day will allow students to add grout to finish the piece. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

With guidance from Judy Gregurich and Mark Montgomery, students will learn the art of copper foil stained glass, originally invented by Louis Tiffany. Master the techniques of working with glass, and learn how to create beautiful works from a variety of colors. This class is a prerequisite for Independent Study Stained Glass. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$175 for non-members and \$157.50 for current CAC members + \$75 supply fee

Independent Study Stained Glass

8-class session / Tuesday,

21) from 7-9 PM

With guidance from Judy Gregurich and Mark Montgomery, this class is designed for students who have taken a previous stained glass class at the Center. Students may work on their own projects at their own pace with assistance from the instructors as needed. In addition, the instructors provide an optional "challenge project" that pushes the skills and creativity of students. This class is held in the lower gallery and downstairs classroom.

Ceramics: Wednesday evenings

6-class session / Wednesday, October 11-November 15 from 6-9 PM

With guidance from Maureen Duffy-Daugavietis, students will learn basic techniques for wheel throwing, hand building, and how to finish their works using standard decorating and glazing styles. Students will rotate between both methods to create finished ceramic works. This class is recommended for beginners & advanced beginners. Higher-level students can work on independent projects per instructor approval. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Partner Wheel Throwing Workshop

1-day workshop / Friday, October 13 from 6-9 PM

Get your *Ghost* on during the spookiest night of the year! Grab your bestie, partner, spouse, or sibling for a fun evening of creating together in pairs. With guidance from Maureen Duffy-Daugavietis, students will learn basic wheel throwing techniques with a partner as each student throws a small bowl or vessel. Registration is per pair, and students will share a wheel with their partner. Students will complete glazing, and the Center will complete firing. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Glass Fusing II Workshop

1-day workshop / Saturday, October 14 from 1-4 PM

With guidance from Mindy Milan, this advanced workshop is for students who wish to expand their glass fusing experience and knowledge as they exercise their creativity with this medium. Students will use frit, stringers, pebbles, and other forms of glass to create a larger-scale piece or grouping. Techniques will include working with transparency, layering, and cutting glass. Bring your own ideas or get new inspiration in this session! This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$55 for non-members / \$49.50 for current CAC members + \$20 supply fee

Loosen Up with Oil Paints

4-class session / Monday, October 16-November 6 from 7-9 PM

With guidance from award-winning artist Jane Cowley, this exploratory class aims to teach students a looser approach to oil painting in hopes of building confidence and achieving more successful works. Lessons will include composition, color mixing, value, perspective, spatial relations, and various techniques that help students loosen up their hand and see things in a new way. This class is open to all levels, including beginners. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$125 for non-members / \$112.50 for current CAC members + supply list

Understanding Acrylics

1-day workshop / Thursday, October 19 from 10 AM-1 PM

With guidance from Diana Stezalski, students will be introduced to the versatile medium of acrylic paint. Through a series of painting exercises, students will develop a greater understanding of paint application, tools and brush types, and suitable supports for acrylics — growing their confidence altogether. Fundamental skills on color mixing, composition, value, and texture will be addressed. This workshop is recommended for novice and beginner students. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$85 for non-members / \$76.50 for current CAC members, supplies included

Printmaking Workshop

1-day workshop / Saturday, October 28 from 10 AM-2 PM

With guidance from Katie Wiley, students will learn the art of linocut printmaking as they create their own small edition of relief prints. Linocut printmaking is an exciting process whereby a design is carved into a rubber-like material, inked, and then transferred onto a piece of paper to create a series of 'relief prints'. Students will learn safe carving techniques, proper inking with a brayer, how to pull a clean print, and how to title their masterpiece. The final product will be a series of 3+ prints, each completed with a unique title, edition number, and artist's signature. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Exploring Watermedia Workshop

1-day workshop / Saturday, October 28 from 10 AM-1 PM

With guidance from certified art teacher Laura Krentz, students will learn the basics of working with watercolor and gouache paints in a stress-free workshop atmosphere. Students will learn how to do washes, wet-in-wet techniques, lifting color, and special tricks to enhance their work with simple tools and techniques as they create a scene of fall florals. This workshop is recommended for beginners. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.
